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MACKAY & DISTRICT 4WD CLUB Inc. ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS (05-05-04)

ACTIVITIES

 (a) The Trip Leader should remind all drivers before moving off, that convoy procedure should be followed. Participants on trips will obey the Trip Leader's instructions at all times regarding speed, position in convoy, convoy procedure and route to be taken on or off roads and tracks. The Trip Leader's instructions will not be deviated from except in the case of discussion by all members on the trip and a majority vote on the proposed deviation by those members pre-

Prior to the start of a trip, the Leader must:

- Arrange suitable rendezvous during the trip at which all vehicles stop. These are based on either time or distance.
- ii. Inform the driver of the last vehicle that he/she is the last vehicle in the convoy.
- Check with drivers of vehicles that all basic essential equipment is carried in or on each vehicle. Refer Clauses 4 and 5.
- iv. Check with drivers that any specially requested equipment is carried in or on vehicles.
- (b) The lead vehicle will stop at any turn-off or intersection at which doubt may exist as to the correct direction. It will wait for the following vehicle before moving off in the correct direction. Each successive vehicle will then wait for the following vehicle before moving off. By this means, all will follow the lead vehicle and a message can also be sent in both directions along the convoy. At other times it is the responsibility of any preceding vehicle to keep the vehicle following in sight.
- (c) No vehicle in convoy will pass another vehicle in convoy without the Trip Leader's instructions, unless under exceptional circumstances, whilst the convoy is moving.
- (d) When travelling in convoy on main roads, the distance between any vehicle should not be less than six (6) vehicle lengths, to assist overtaking traffic.
- (e) Avoid driving too close to the vehicle in front on bush tracks, where ratio changing and braking could be a problem.
- (f) Persons leaving Association convoy or group MUST notify the trip leader and if possible, give details of their intentions.
- No unofficial competitions or displays of "Four wheel driving" shall take place during Association trips without permission of Property Owner and/or Trip Leader. [Refer Clause 1 (a) paragraph 3].
- 3) Vehicles must be registered, maintained and in a good road-worthy condition. The Association reserves the right to demand a Safety Certificate from an authorized Inspection Station designated by the Association, at the Member's expense. All drivers shall hold a current Drivers License.
- Every 4WD vehicle on Association trips and/or 4WD activity must be fitted with front and rear towing points.
- Every 4WD vehicle must carry basic recovery gear and First Aid Kit on Association activities.
- Permission must be obtained from property owners before travelling on their property. Permits required MUST BE OBTAINED for Forestry and National Parks.

- 7) No animals will be brought on Association trips.
- 8) Fuel tanks must be filled prior to the departure time of the trip.
- 9) Fire-arms prohibited on all Association trips and activities.
- At Association functions, members are expected to follow verbal instructions and visual signs erected by the organizers. Association members are responsible for their visitors.
- 11) (a) Bushfire regulations shall be obeyed at all times.
 - (b) Camp and billy fires must be totally extinguished by water, and/or covered with earth.
- 12) Before breaking camp members will clear the site of all litter and rubbish deposited during their stay, and carry it with them away from the camp area to a designated rubbish dump or receptacle.
- 13) When crossing private property and crown land under lease, gates, clip-rails and property will be left as found, or as instructed by the Trip Leader. Where gates are to be opened/closed, the first vehicle behind the Trip Leader will pull over and open the gate and after the convoy passes this vehicle will close same and fall into convoy in front of Tail End Charlie. This rotation procedure will be repeated for each gate open/closure.
- 14) No member of the Association will at any time knowingly give information of any kind to any person, who is not a member of the Association, which may assist that person to gain access to areas which the Association visits on Association activities where those areas are "off the beaten track", or not general knowledge.
- 15) The wearing of **seatbelts** is mandatory. Riding on vehicle bonnets and tailgates is prohibited.
- (a) Fauna will not be disturbed. Fishing excepted where permitted.
 - (b) Flora of any description is not to be removed under any circumstances whilst on Association activities.
- 17) Motorcycles to be excluded from attending Association outings and field days. Property owner has discretionary powers
- 18) No person shall exceed the legal alcohol limit when driving in any Association activity. Nor shall any person consume such alcohol while driving in any Association activity.
- 19) Tracks and roads should not be deviated from. This is particularly relevant where Parthenium, Giant Rats Tail or other noxious weed is present. Where required by property owner, appropriate vehicle washdown shall take place. Any damage caused to tracks and roads will be repaired where required and/or where practicable.
- 20) It is mandatory for members of M&D4WDC, if when visiting or traversing official club properties to pursue 4WD activity and on other than a current M&D4WDC event, to register their name and the date in the Activities Book.

ADMINISTRATION

- Any elected Association Member is disallowed from holding the same Official Committee Member position, after having served three consecutive terms of office in that same role.
- The appointed <u>Committee Member</u> term extends to 6 months overall, with the <u>Assistant Committee Member</u> whose term of 3 months is included in the 6 months term assumes voting rights after 3 months when the <u>Committee Member</u> retires and the new <u>Assistant</u> is appointed.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

- Pink Ribbon charity Held in 19th 20th
 October at Mulherin Park. Did we want to set
 up a stall to display our club? They have
 package deals. \$4000, \$2000, \$500. That will
 give us advertising on banners on the day and
 on their email. Any interest? (We have
 already donated \$100 to Cancer Fund
 Association.)
- The ECO Barge Clean Seas foundation is proposing to have a beach clean-up day on the 19th of May. Most of the defined areas have been taken up by the clubs around town. The Landrover club is doing one area. We have volunteered to assist the Qld Parks & Wildlife Service with the Cape Palmerston area. They will supply all the collection bags, gloves, sun cream, water, etc for the morning.



- They will also supply smoko & a B-B-Q lunch when we are finished around 12 noon. Bruce will add this to our trip sheet.
- Steve Whykes brought to our attention that the 'Four Wheel Drive Industrial Council' will not accept 4wd's that have ROPs onto mine sites. This will mean that 4wd with 15-20k protection gear will no longer be allowed on site. This includes roll cages, fire extinguishers, bullbars etc. From 2016, no protection gear will be made for 4wd that are made in 2016 onwards. An email will be sent to club members for more information.
- The committee would like to advise that your 4wd should have at least a 5watt radio installed. If your radio is not working before a trip, it will have to be fixed before you are allowed to go on the next trip. The 2 watt handhelds are just not sufficient for communication while travelling. Additionally, we would like to add that members have the required recovery gear and a first Aid kit. Terry & Kathy have included such a list into this month's Club Magazine as a guide.
- The committee discussed the way our club accepts membership on the first night new members join our club. Committee members questioned if new comers coming to see what we are about maybe don't really know what type of club they are joining. We are a family oriented club that go camping in locations that need a 4wd. We don't have a race track that we can rip up and race around. Other clubs are more stringent about new memberships. We proposed that when newcomers come attend their first meeting, they pay \$30 (half amount of joining fee) (refundable/non refundable), do the driver awareness and then if they are still keen, we vote them in the following 4wd meeting. This was the procedure in the past & we feel that this should be the current attitude as well. To be discussed in General Business.
- Camp toilets There was a discussion on toilets. Lots of people bring their own toilet.
 Some people pitch it up near other people's camp set-up. Others loathe setting up the

After a survey of the situation and much discussion a vote was taken to hit the inland road first up and come back along the beach. Everyone set about airing down and making any adjustments that were needed and we headed off.

HORSE CREEK DAY TRIP – 21 APRIL 2013

What a great attendance for this trip: Jeeps represented by (Grand Cherokee) Michael W-G with his boys and one of their mates, (JK Wrangler) Iain P and Mel and (TJ Wrangler) John L with Jarred. In Patrols were Rob and Karen P with Rhys and Mitch, Bruce W as trip leader, Ritesh and Geeta with their littl'uns, Gavin and Stacey, Peter and Vivian, Quenton and Lilla, and Ken and Ange with Kiera. Andrew and Donna with Jai and Tai were along in their shiny Prado, Mick G was in his Landcruiser with Aaron in the passenger seat and Laurie was there representing team Hilux. A fantastic turnout with 33 people along for the adventure which included 11 kids, and more importantly..... two other Jeeps on the trip WOOHOOO!

All assembled at Wests in Walkerston and the convoy set off at 8.25am with talk of how the track was going to be considering the overnight rain. There was the usual over-the-radio banter with people checking their radios, some catching up on recent trips and tales, and of course taking the mickey at every opportunity.

I would like to gratuitously take the opportunity to say thanks to the people at Nixon Communications. I went in there the day before the trip to see if I could book my radio in to get looked at. There was one of their fitters in at the time but not rostered on, just visiting. He overheard me explaining the problems I was having with my radio and despite the fact that it was his day off he offered to have a look at it for me. After a quick look around he adjusted a few settings and splashed a bit of solder around and now the radio is operational again. That's service with a capital "S" in my book so thanks very much to Nixon's!

We got to the dirt road turnoff at the back of Pinnacle at 9 am and was agreed that we would pull in for a quick smoko at Captain's Crossing before tackling the Horse Creek loop track. Well we only had four vehicles onto the creek bed when word rang out that Andrew's Prado had slid off the track going down onto the creek bed and that winches were required. A very clever recovery was employed whereby a vehicle up and behind and to the right attached its winch cable to the back of the Prado and another vehicle was attached down and forward and to the right. This enabled the Prado to be pulled sideways out of the ditch and back onto the track without any side damage. Very clever and interesting to watch. All this and we hadn't even hit the tough track so with this in mind some of the vehicles elected to give the creek bed a miss.



After enjoying a quick break with smoko by the flowing creek it was back to the main track and onto Horse Creek. Along the way some vehicle elected to take a small detour down into a bypass track that was plagued with very deep erosion ruts on the steep descent and ascent which was impressively conquered by all who attempted it, except one me and my Jeep. I had to have a few attempts at the second half of the uphill out but with the Rob's expert guidance and the V8 growling I got out, alas this is the point where I think I blew out my rear left shockie.





We proceeded on to the Horse Creek loop track turnoff and within 500m the next obstacle was encountered. A long deeply rutted downhill track leading down to a large strong flowing creek greeted us and although the first couple of vehicles got down, lain and Mel in the KJ Wrangler slid sideways into an extremely deep rut which no option but to winch out. With those on their way down to the creek some energetic tossing of boulders, rocks and logs ensued. With the track stacked in such a way as to push the steer tyres away from the rut the rest of the convoy was able to press on down. It was pretty gnarly with the "Jesus" bar on the passenger side of Peter's Nissan getting a workout!

The creek at the bottom had a boulder strewn edge and was strong flowing at about 600mm deep and about four car lengths across so that washed out a bit of the mud from under our vehicles. The problem with this was that each vehicle was carrying a lot of water out of the creek and the water was draining out all the way up the slippery track up and out the other side. Ritesh was having a bit of a battle with traction up the hill but with words of encouragement and direction Bruce managed to guide Ritesh and the next few vehicles to the top. Peter assumed the role for the second half of the convoy and in no time we were all up and away. By the time we travelled a few more hundred metres we caught up with the first half of the convoy stopped again. This time there was a tree down across the track. The roaring sound of manly chainsaws erupted and testosterone flowed freely. Within half an hour we were back on our way again.



It was at about this stage that I began to think that we might be getting home a little later than planned tonight and it was beginning to become quite evident that there were a few key factors that had come into play that had got us through to this point on the track. They were good communication, patience, teamwork and looking out for those behind us. Everyone had contributed in some fashion to those around them getting through which was great.



Next obstacle was the hairpin left turn drop off into and up out of a small creek then back up a short steep bank with hairpin turn out. The drop in was particularly nerveracking as it was a sheer blind drop in where we just had to trust the person guiding us. John, who was tail-end Charlie in his TJ Jeep ran right up to this tricky entry point and guided most of us down and in. I managed to get crossed up coming out of the little creek and luckily Peter was able to turn around and come back down to snatch me out. It was at this stage that I blew out my right front shockie so from now on I was floating on two coil springs and only two functioning shockies. Coming back out and onto the hairpin was made even more tricky due to it becoming wetter with each vehicle coming out. There was also a large gum tree threatening to bang some side panels if we slid too far sideways but the dense clumps of lantana between the cars and the tree bounced us back in the other direct away from the tree. Give me bush pin-striping over panel damage any day I say.



A clear pattern was emerging, go, stop, go, stop, go a little further then stop again. Mud everywhere, lots of sloppy puddles, everyone slipping and sliding, and everyone enjoying the challenge (but maybe the previously mentioned "Jesus" bar was getting too much of a workout by this stage!). An hour had passed since we left the chain sawed tree behind and we had only progressed a further 1 kilometre.



A bit further on and Bruce had arrived at somewhat of an impasse. A deep shot gully with two exit options required a double snatch block recovery with his winch and only just managed to get through only to find a much worse spot only a very short distance past that. The next two cars tried the gully without success as it had been messed up badly from just one vehicle. By this stage the whole convoy had caught up and gathered at the gully for assessment.

It was almost 2pm and with at least 75% of the loop track still ahead of us (we had only managed about 3kms in the 3 ½ hrs since we left Captains Crossing) it was unanimously agreed that the best course of action would be to turn around and head back out. It was also decreed that it was time that had beaten us and not the track. Given how well we had all worked together to get each other to this point we still felt we had achieved a great deal considering what the track had thrown at us.

We knew that we should expect equally challenging progress on the trip out but what seemed like no time at all we emerged

back out of the start of the loop track with very few incidents along the way, or so we thought at least. With seven vehicles out in close succession we pulled over to the side of the main dirt road and waited......and waited, and no-one else had come out. A couple of cars decided to double back to see what was holding them up. One car had somehow gone totally off the track and was being cradled precariously sideways on a nasty angle by some thankfully robust lantana bushes (I had better not mention Ritesh's name here as I don't want him to feel embarrassed). Some more clever winching was employed and another Nissan was rescued from the brink. I believe that there were a few other close calls from the group bringing up the rear.



Those of us that were up front and had conquered the trip out without incident, made our way back to Captains Crossing. We arrived there just after 3pm and proceeded to air up our tyres, reflect on the day's events and plan to revisit the track after it has had a chance to dry out a fair bit. While the kids got a chance to stretch their legs and have a play in the sand on the creek's edge I decided to have a look over the car not looking forward to the cleanup up when I got home. As well as mud wedged into every crevice under the car and mud all over the outside of the car. even on the roof, I noticed that the inside door panels on the passenger side and the rear doors also had a liberal pasting of small muddy shoe and foot prints. Oh joy. Then when I was clearing some muck out from under that radiator I discovered that I



must have belted the steering damper on a rock or something as it was dented and cracked and bleeding a little. Bloody hell this had turned into and expensive 3km drive!!



With everyone assembled back at Captains Crossing by 3.30pm and compressors humming away it was great to see that everyone, although muddy and tired, were in great spirits and had enjoyed not only the challenges presented by the tracks but also the camaraderie and teamwork that had gotten us all through (reasonably) unscathed. After a group shout of all those who attended (I was behind the camera) we all set on our way home for a big clean-up and a couple of coldies I'm sure.



Thanks to everyone helped each other along the tracks and a special thanks to Bruce for leading the trip and to John for putting his hand up for the role of tail-end Charlie. It was great to see so many people and the kids had a great time too. It was particularly memorable for me as this

was the first time that I have been on a club trip with other jeeps in the convoy. I look forward to seeing them and everyone else again on the tracks soon.
