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MACKAY & DISTRICT 4WD CLUB Inc. ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS (16-06-14)

ACTIVITIES

- (a) The Trip Leader should remind all drivers before moving off, that convoy procedure should be followed. Participants on trips will obey the Trip Leader's instructions at all times regarding speed, position in convoy, convoy procedure and route to be taken on or off roads and tracks. The Trip Leader's instructions will not be deviated
 - The Trip Leader's instructions will not be deviated from except in the case of discussion by all members on the trip and a majority vote on the proposed deviation by those members present

Prior to the start of a trip, the Leader must:

- Arrange suitable rendezvous during the trip at which all vehicles stop. These are based on either time or distance
- ii. Inform the driver of the last vehicle that he/she is the last vehicle in the convoy.
- iii. Check with drivers of vehicles that all basic essential equipment is carried in or on each vehicle. Refer Clauses 4 and 5.
- iv. Check with drivers that any specially requested equipment is carried in or on vehicles.
 - (b) The lead vehicle will stop at any turn-off or intersection at which doubt may exist as to the correct direction. It will wait for the following vehicle before moving off in the correct direction. Each successive vehicle will then wait for the following vehicle before moving off. By this means, all will follow the lead vehicle and a message can also be sent in both directions along the convoy. At other times it is the responsibility of any preceding vehicle to keep the vehicle following in sight.
 - (c) No vehicle in convoy will pass another vehicle in convoy without the Trip Leader's instructions, unless under exceptional circumstances, whilst the convoy is moving.
 - (d) When travelling in convoy on main roads, the distance between any vehicle should not be less than six (6) vehicle lengths, to assist overtaking traffic.
 - (e) Avoid driving too close to the vehicle in front on bush tracks, where ratio changing and braking could be a problem.
 - (f) Persons leaving Association convoy or group MUST notify the trip leader and if possible, give details of their intentions.
- No unofficial competitions or displays of "Four wheel driving" shall take place during Association trips without permission of Property Owner and/or Trip Leader. [Refer Clause 1 (a) paragraph 3].
- 3) Vehicles must be registered, maintained and in a good roadworthy condition. The Association reserves the right to demand a Safety Certificate from an authorized Inspection Station designated by the Association, at the Member's expense. All drivers shall hold a current Drivers License.
- 4) Every 4WD vehicle on Association trips and/or 4WD activity must be fitted with front and rear towing points.
- 5) Every 4WD vehicle must carry basic recovery gear and First Aid Kit on Association activities.
- 6) Permission must be obtained from property owners before travelling on their property. Permits required MUST BE OBTAINED for Forestry and National Parks.
- 7) No animals will be brought on Association trips.
- 8) Fuel tanks must be filled prior to the departure time of the trip.

- 9) Fire-arms prohibited on all Association trips and activities.
- 10) At Association functions, members are expected to follow verbal instructions and visual signs erected by the organizers. Association members are responsible for their visitors.
- 11) (a) Bushfire regulations shall be obeyed at all times.
 - (b) Camp and billy fires must be totally extinguished by water, and/or covered with earth.
- 12) Before breaking camp members will clear the site of all litter and rubbish deposited during their stay, and carry it with them away from the camp area to a designated rubbish dump or receptacle.
- 13) When crossing private property and crown land under lease, gates, clip-rails and property will be left as found, or as instructed by the Trip Leader. Where gates are to be opened/closed, the first vehicle behind the Trip Leader will pull over and open the gate and after the convoy passes this vehicle will close same and fall into convoy in front of Tail End Charlie. This rotation procedure will be repeated for each gate open/closure.
- 14) No member of the Association will at any time knowingly give information of any kind to any person, who is not a member of the Association, which may assist that person to gain access to areas which the Association visits on Association activities where those areas are "off the beaten track", or not general knowledge.
- 15) The wearing of seatbelts is mandatory. Riding on vehicle bonnets and tailgates is prohibited.
- 16) (a) Fauna will not be disturbed. Fishing excepted where permitted.
 - (b) Flora of any description is not to be removed under any circumstances whilst on Association activities.
- 17) Motorcycles to be excluded from attending Association outings and field days. Property owner has discretionary powers
- 18) No person shall exceed the legal alcohol limit when driving in any Association activity.
- 19) Tracks and roads should not be deviated from. This is particularly relevant where Parthenium, Giant Rats Tail or other noxious weed is present. Where required by property owner, appropriate vehicle washdown shall take place. Any damage caused to tracks and roads will be repaired where required and/or where practicable.
- 20) It is mandatory for members of M&D4WDC, if when visiting or traversing official club properties to pursue 4WD activity and on other than a current M&D4WDC event, to register their name and the date in the Activities Book.

ADMINISTRATION

 Any elected Association Member is disallowed from holding the same Official Committee Member position, after having served three consecutive terms of office in that same role, however, if there are no nominations for a particular office and the member agrees to renominate, this will be permissible by majority vote at the AGM.

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



Pine Loop Track

A new track to explore – grade 4-5 – haven't had one of those for a long time. A quick check that we had recovery points and recovery gear and off we went, deairing at the start of the gravel road. An easy climb along the gravel and then we turned off at along the new track. John had mapped it out on his GPS by following Google maps, but wasn't sure if this would be the track we would follow. It wasn't long before we hit a bit of a washout and started flexing the axles. John's new FJ45 seemed to be handling it OK.

The hardest part of the track was a long washed out deco descent. There was an alternate rock track to one side, but John was halfway down before he realised. Not that that would have stopped him going the somewhat harder way, but he might have jumped out for a look a bit sooner. It was too steep to reverse and he was on the wrong line to keep going down, but there was only one way – down. Front wheels got up on the higher part of the track, but back wheels were caught in the ruts, so the FJ crabbed its way down for about 20m until the deepest part of the washout. There was a fair bit of sidelong, leading to a bit of discomfort, but he carried on and through the little creek at the bottom. Pete was next and picked a better line, with all wheels on the higher part until the deep washout, but go through OK. Tim & Jeff were next, with Bruce following, all negotiating the better line. Leon opted for the rocky alternate track.

We carried on and came out at Captain's Crossing, where we pulled up for an early lunch break. Leon's little boy Jason was running around the banks of the creek when a Triton Ute drove along the opposite bank "Toy, toy" he said. Leon was unimpressed with this description of a vehicle very similar to his.

We had made good time, so decided to do the track in

reverse. All good until we got to the long descent, which was now a long tricky ascent. John decided discretion was the better part of valour and headed up the rocky alternate track. Pete drove up the main track, diff lockers assisting in getting through the deep part of the washout and on to the high part of the track – perfect line. Tim thought he would also try the main track, but lost traction at the deep washout. He had already been crowned King of the Sidelong due to being the furthest tilted over all day, but this was the best.

He stopped with the Nissan leaning well over to the right and left front wheel well up in the air. Jeff managed to open the door to jump out, but Tegan couldn't hold the weight of the door, ultimately jumping out of the window. Tim was left in the driver's seat, able to touch the ground out of his window. He tried reversing a couple of times to get another run up, but kept losing grip. The truck was still on a severe lean, and Tim didn't want to try to reverse down for fear of scraping the side. Out came Pete's winch from the top, but it wasn't that simple – the truck kept staying in the ruts to the right instead of heading onto the higher part on the left. A bit of shovelling, a judiciously placed rock or two, an addition of a snatch block to get the pull angle better and he got out OK.

Bruce tried the main track too, but suffered the same fate as Tim, spinning out at the deep washout. He managed to reverse down under John's guidance, then drove up the rocky alternate followed by Leon.
